Professor Peter Donnelly (1980)



Professor Peter Donnelly is Director of the Wellcome Trust Centre for Human Genetics and Professor of Statistical Science at the University of Oxford. He chaired the Wellcome Trust Case Control Consortium (WTCCC) and its successor, WTCCC2, a large international collaboration studying the genetic basis of more than 20 common human diseases and conditions in over 60,000 people.

Peter is a fellow of St Anne's College, and an Honorary Fellow of Balliol College, in Oxford. He has received numerous awards and honours for his research. With colleagues Peter founded Genomics plc. He is now a Director and recently took on the role of CEO of the company.

Sir Gregory Winter FRS



Sir Gregory Winter FRS is a Master of Trinity College Cambridge and was until recently a member of the Medical Research Council's Laboratory of Molecular Biology (LMB) in Cambridge. He is a scientist, inventor and entrepreneur. He is a pioneer of the science of protein engineering, and in particular of technologies for making pharmaceutical antibodies. Such antibodies have proved useful for treatment of cancer and immune disorders, and now comprise many of the world's top selling pharmaceutical drugs.

In order to see his technologies applied. Sir Gregory founded Cambridge Antibody Technology and Domantis (both acquired in 2006 by AstraZeneca and GSK respectively), and most recently Bicycle Therapeutics, which is developing bicyclic peptides with chemical warheads for treatment of cancer.
